What Is a Poker Run?

This summer we're trying a new poker run by using the lake and picking up cards by boat, jet ski, kayak, or canoe. This poker run participants will travel on the lake to 5 houses picking up a [playing card](#) at each stop. Then go to the main beach to pick up a final card and meet your fellow participants for a beach party. The goal is to end up with the best poker hand at the end of the run.

Entrance fee \$25 per hand

Each registration is numbered

Play as many hands as you'd like

You will get a numbered wrist band for each registration.

Maps will be provided the day of the event at the lodge .

Winner is awarded 50% of the take

LIMIT- 52 wrist bands

Return to the main Beach by 3:30
Winners announced at 4 PM



Poker Run Rules

1. Participants must have a numbered wrist band to participate.
2. Each entry is allowed to draw one card at each of the stops.
3. The card you pick up will be numbered to correspond with your wrist band
4. If playing more than one hand/wristband you cannot combine numbered cards
5. Participants must complete the run and be back to the lodge no later than 3:30
6. In case of a tie, there will be a draw for High Card to determine the winner on each side



partypoker Poker hands

Royal flush



A royal flush is an ace high straight flush.

Straight flush



A straight flush is a five-card straight, all in the same suit.

Four of a kind



Four of a kind, or quads, are four cards of equal value.

Full house



A full house contains a set (3) of cards of one value and a pair of another value.

Flush



A flush is any five cards, all of the same suit.

Straight



Five cards of sequential value. Every possible straight will contain either a 5 or a 10.

Three of a kind



Three cards of the same rank.

Two pair



This is two cards of one value and another two cards of another value.

Pair



One pair is two cards of the same rank.

High card



The hand with the highest card(s) wins.
