2025 August 21 HLPOA
Monthly Membership Meeting

President Eric Griffin called the meeting to order at 7pm with 12 members signed in.

All stood for the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll call was taken with all 5 directors present.

The minutes from the July 24 membership meeting were approved as posted on NextDoor and in the August Beacon with a motion by Chris H and second by Chris P.

President's Report: Eric Griffin

Eric had nothing to report on at this time.

Vice President's Report: Chris Pheiffer

Chris gave an update on the maintenance and facilities. During the past month Josh and crew have completed a lot of tree trimming/removal and brush trimming on our properties all around the community.... Including but not limited to Mirror Lake area, Holiday Dive, Big Bass Lake.

The aerators are now up and running on Big Bass Lake. 4 new ones were purchased with the 1 that was still functioning for a total of 5 on that lake now.

Our 3 summer workers are done for the season and back at school. We thank Mason, Trey and Ryan for all their hard work this summer season.

Barb H 912 commended the crew on the excellent level of help they provided during LakeFest. The guys were on top of everything and a great help to the committee.

Chris continued his report with an update on the S5SD. Chris has been in touch with S5SD president Tom Secor. Tom reports that the sewer district has been very busy with behind the scenes work and that they are very close to having some "real" numbers of final costs of this project. He feels the district will be able to call a meeting close to the end of September with the numbers finalized.

The engineers finalizing the permanent locations of the grinder pumps as well as the signing of each member's easement has been pushed back a bit. Apparently, this step was not needed (as first thought) for the determination of final cost.

The S5SD hopes to have the project out for bid by March 2026

There has been no update as to the actual completion date.

There will be an annual billing by the S5SD as the last 2 years. They will provide earlier notification than last year. We can expect the amount to remain the same and the bill to come out this fall. The city of Willard will be handling all the billing going forward. We can expect a yearly bill from the S5SD until the project hits our property taxes (which are billed in arrears.)

Jane N 1230 Asked when to expect the S5SD bill.

Tom "anticipates" around October 1 with payment due just before the first of next year. The district is committed to a better billing time frame as opposed to last year's.

Chris went on to address an issue that was brought up at last month's meeting; being transparent with our membership stats. He gave some examples from the month of July:

15 warning letters were issued

3 fines levied

26 titles and registrations

10 permits

9 members sent to collections

11 cases are currently with our lawyers in some phase of foreclosure

We also have a couple of potential lawsuits in the hands of our lawyers



Rose Ann 943 Stated that knowing these numbers will make a lot of our members happy. Chris replied that we have always been active with these types of things, but we wanted to put some "hard" numbers together just to show it.

Reg B 706 Asked what most of the warning letters and fines were for. He didn't want any names, just to know what the most common basis for these letters and fines was. Boating safety violations are by far the most common. Reminder.... If you see an offense, a dangerous or unsafe violation, a complaint should be filed with the office. Physical proof (picture, video, additional witnesses etc.) give "teeth" to the complaint. We treat these complaints like business. Straight forward. If a rule is broken and someone reports, a letter or fine (dependent on each situation as documented in our rules) is issued.



Eric chimed in and announced that a fall drive around on the lake would happen again this fall. Basically, to identify situations that need attention so that when notified the members when notified can address the infraction over the winter.

Jane N 1280 Asked what the on water drive around “looks for”. Things such as dilapidated docks.

Jen B 706 Asked if the lake would be lowered as far as last year.

Henry answered that we currently have engineering companies bidding on the next phase of the concrete spillway maintenance and if necessary, repair. The water has to be away from the bottom of the gate for the inspection. Then a report will be generated and drawings rendered in order to create a plan. The State of Ohio is due to inspect our spillway and dam next year as well.

Jeff H 912 Asked if this was all precautionary work. Yes...we are trying to stay ahead of any potential issues.

Treasurer's Report: Henry Jarrett

Henry provided the cash basis vs budget report through July 31, 2025. Lake Fest numbers are still being tweaked, but the numbers fall right in line with the last couple years. All in all the financials are in good shape.

Secretary's Report: Lynda Snyder

The Social Committee's upcoming events over Labor Day weekend are as follows:

Last community breakfast Saturday 8/30 8-11 Come out and support this great cause, enjoy a delicious breakfast. This is a by donation event, and your generous donations support our events all year long.

“Early” Veterans Day Boat Parade - a new tradition started by a few last year to honor our veterans, in memory of Rich Colley. Sign up in the office, decorate your boat, meet by the Rt. 99 bridge by noon and “parade” around the lake.

Then our annual Duck Race Fundraiser Event will take place from 3-6pm down by the maintenance garage. Ducks can be purchased NOW using the QR code found on the flyer, in the August Beacon, or on the website: holidaylakes.org. Bounce houses, games, food trucks, restrooms and picnic tables add to the excitement of the actual duck races!

We are still accepting donations for the Kay Hartz Memorial. Kay was a vital part of our community serving in various positions for many years. Plans are for a bench and flowering tree or shrub near the main beach in her memory.

The fall Ohio Lake Community Association (OLCA) meeting will be held at Lake Roaming Rock Wednesday and Thursday September 17 & 18. Lynda will attend.

Finally, the Welcome Committee has reached out to all the new members to date. We will cease our visits shortly after Labor Day. Director's Report: Chris Hassmann

Safety Committee:

Chris stated that anyone seeing the Bug man on the Segway should call the Sheriff. Holiday Lakes has a no solicitation policy. This man has been told this several times and has stated that he has obtained a permit from the City of Willard, but that doesn't apply to Holiday Lakes.

Jeff H 912 Said he was at their house and Jeff asked to take a picture of the man's business card and he refused, leading Jeff to believe this was a scam.

Chris admitted how hard it is to approach people on the lake that are doing unsafe or breaking our rules or the ODNR rules. People argue and don't pay attention, even though we are out there trying our best to “protect” the lake and other boaters.

Lake Management Committee:

Chris made it known that he misspoke at last month's meeting when asked about the bathometric study the board has approved. The study is a GPS enabled hydro acoustic study that will indeed map the bottom contours of the lake and WILL ALSO map the levels and location of sediment allowing us to pinpoint where dredging is needed. The results from this study will help enable the committee to make a dredging plan and provide a baseline for moving forward. The study will be done this fall when the lake is quiet

Chris also has been in contact with the Huron County Soil and water district. A liaison between neighbors has agreed to help begin discussions with the farmers whose fields run off into our lake.

The next topic Chris addressed was the recent high bacteria count found in the county's monthly testing of our lake water. On July 28 we had about 3” of rain that fell, causing the lake to rise over 6”. The testing was done on July 30 at 11:30 am less than 48 hrs. from the major rain. When heavy rain falls, it causes the bacteria levels to rise. On Aug 5 when the test results came in, we were advised that the levels were high and we should notify our community, which we did. (But this was 6 days later and who knows what the levels were by then....) Josh retested the water on August 11, and the results came back today August 21 (10 days this time) ...stating everything was within safe limits for recreational swimming. The bottom line here is that you swim at your own risk. We will notify when we are aware of

unsafe levels or conditions. If you have a compromised immune system or open cuts, wounds or sores, it's probably safest not to swim after heavy rainfall. ***Showering off after a swim in the lake is also good advice***

Jeff H 912 asked if the railroad reservoir was still dumped into the lake. We are unaware of this but do know that Willard's CSO (Combined Sewer Overflow) is released into the lake on occasion. The city must notify when this occurs.

Jen B 706 Asked with the bathometric study, is there a certain "right" depth in channels or coves/ That is a good question, and we are hoping the survey will give us good information on those type situations.

Jane N 1280 Asked when the survey would be done. Later this fall and it will take approximately 4 days to complete.

Rick G 1333 Asked about boats on the water and if the study would be after the boats were off the water. Boats will steer clear of the study boat which will have an "escort" boat with it.... Some boat traffic will be fine... just not anything like a summer Saturday afternoon!

Tom P 748 Asked if anything ever came of the kids doing the Ding Dong Ditch and the sheriff cars out here looking for the 7 kids, whom all dispersed....

The sheriff has been seen just driving through the neighborhoods making their presence known, which is a good thing for our community.

Old Business:

New Business:

Henry explained the purpose and credentials of the members of his Finance Committee. After several meetings it became apparent that 60+ years of data are stored in various boxes and cabinets at the lodge. Kay Hartz daughters also brought 8 boxes of historical documents to Henry. They became aware of the need for some sort of document retention. Brad Nelson has volunteered to take on this huge task with 3 other volunteers. The number 1 goal is to digitalize the documents, and then the 2nd goal is to make them searchable. He plans to use AI to help. He has already started sorting and sifting through documents. This is going to be a time consuming, but interesting project.

Eric asked about the costs affiliated with this undertaking. Brad is looking into a scanner (\$700) and he also suggested some plastic storage bins for the actual documents we need to save even after scanning.

Chris H asked Brad about the ability to scan large drawings and documents.... which Brad said would still probably need to be outsourced.

Chris P asked if Brad could help us craft a record retention plan. Yes.

Barb H 912 Asked Josh if he knew about the hole in the closet floor that the cleaning supplies are in. She saw a mouse and evidence of mice in that room. Josh is aware as it is from the old pop system the Brass used to have in that closet; Josh will plug the hole.

Brad N 1280 asked that when Lynda goes to the OLCA conference she asks if other member lakes have any type of record retention system in place. Yes.

Rose Ann 943 Announced the she and Renee have come up with a plan to include a separate sheet with each member's individualized sticker information and what is needed for their 2026 stickers to be sent along with the yearly dues statement next February.

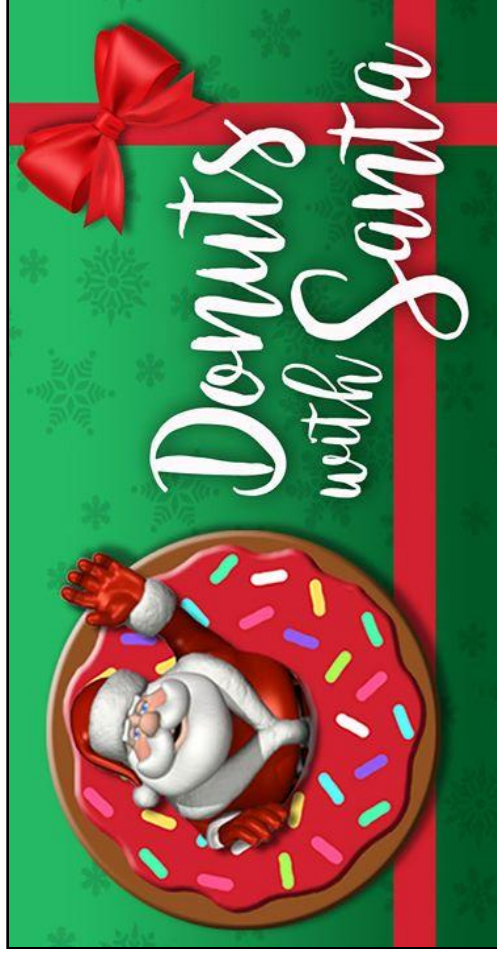

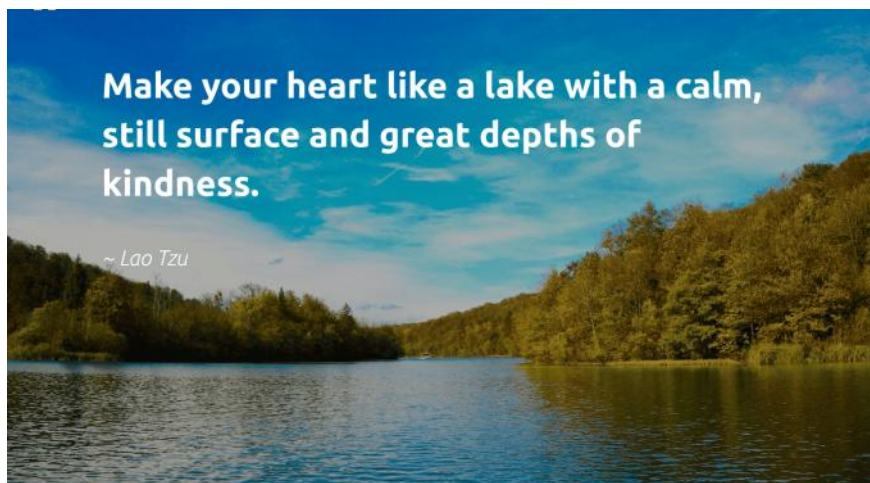

Holiday Lakes Safety Committee Reminder

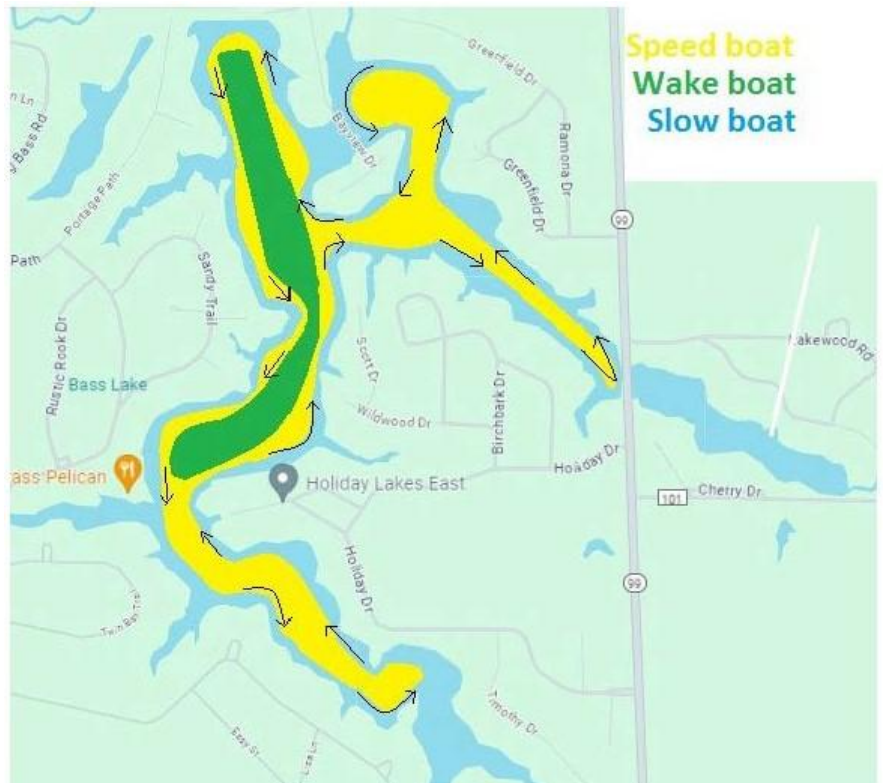
All boaters at Holiday Lakes must follow our published association rules, which work alongside Ohio state boating laws. Since these rules are directly safety-related, there is a \$250 fine for the first offense plus liability for any damages. These rules aren't meant to penalize our community members—they exist to protect everyone's safety and enjoyment of our beautiful lake.

Additional Important Reminder - Nighttime Boating Lighting: We've noticed some confusion about proper boat lighting after dark. When operating your boat at night:

- You must use navigation lights (red and green at bow, white at stern) whenever your boat is moving
- Docking lights are for docking only—using them while cruising can blind other boaters and interfere with everyone's evening enjoyment

Your cooperation helps maintain the safety and beauty of our lake community. Thank you for doing your part to keep Holiday Lakes safe for all.

- B2. All watercrafts including boats, personal watercraft, non-powered boats etc. shall keep to the right shoreline and must travel in a counterclockwise pattern around the lake unless returning directly to a downed skier, tuber, wake surfer or kneeboarder.
- B3. All watercrafts must maintain a distance of at least 60 feet between themselves and other watercraft, skiers, wake surfers, tubers, knee boarders and any other objects on the lake.
- B4. All watercraft advancing on a skier, wake surfer, tuber, or knee boarder should not follow less than 90 feet directly behind in the event skier, wake surfer, tuber, or knee boarder falls. Watercraft engaged in towing a skier, wake surfer, tuber, knee boarder has the right of way.
- B5. No wake is permitted within channels or designated area and all watercraft shall operate at idle speed. Idle speed means the slowest possible speed needed to maintain steerage or maneuverability.
- B6. Boaters should not exceed the capacity standards of their watercraft as established by the manufacturer.
- B7. A). All watercrafts must avoid swimming beaches (unless parking in designated beach parking areas) and other designated areas. Watercraft operating within 50 feet of the beaches, swim areas and swim ropes must operate at idle speed.
B). All watercrafts must not exceed the maximum speed of 40 miles per hour. If a lesser speed is posted, it must be observed.
- B8. A). All watercraft operating on Holiday Lakes between sunset and sunrise must be equipped with operation lights as required by the Ohio Division of Watercraft. During the hours between sunrise and sunset, watercraft shall operate at idle speed. Idle speed means the slowest possible speed needed to maintain steerage or maneuverability.
B). Operation of jet skis (personal watercraft) on the lake between the hours of sunset and sunrise is prohibited.

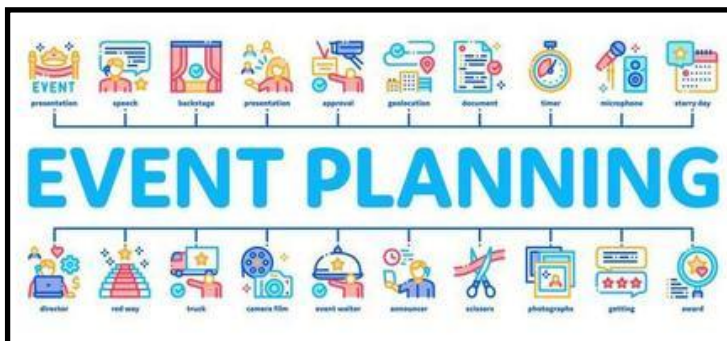

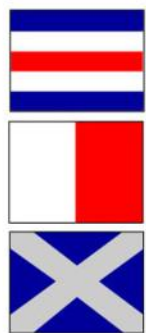
